Farewell and Thank You

This will be my last newsletter as Principal of Remuera Intermediate School. It has been an absolute privilege to be part of RI over the past 21 years. Working with students, staff and community who value education (in the widest sense of the word) has been a wonderful experience. On almost every day something has happened that has made me smile and realise that I'm in the right place, doing the right thing with the right people.

In recent times I have been looking back over my years at RI, thinking about what has changed... and also what has stayed the same.

I remember when I applied for my position at RI, part of the application process was to write 'A Personal Vision' of what I would want for the school. I think it was supposed to be my 'educational philosophy' – you know, big words that nobody really understands, and certainly nobody can measure. Well, I wasn't very good with big words, and so I called my vision, 'Where I'd like to be'.

And it went like this.....

- I want to be in a school where everyone is teaching and everyone is learning. Schools should not merely be a place where the old people are the learned and the young people are the learners. We can all learn from each other.
- I believe that the quality of adult relationships within a school has more to do with the culture and character of that school than any other factor. I want to be in a school where those adult relationships are brilliant caring, supportive, and genuine.
- I know that risk taking is highly associated with learning. If we don't take risks, how can we move forward. If we want our students to be more inventive, more creative, more venturesome, then we, as teachers must model risk taking. New, unusual ideas must be viewed not as a nuisance or embarrassment but as a sign of life and progress. Taking risks and learning from mistakes is 'where I want to be'.
- I want to be in an inclusive school one where differences are respected. One where differences are looked for, and celebrated as opportunities for learning. What is important about people, and about schools, is what is different, not what is the same.
- It's true low anxiety and high standards offer the greatest possibilities for learners, young and old. I want to be remembered in a school for raising standards and lowering anxiety.
- I want to 'make' a school where there is laughter, and humour, and good times. People learn and grow and survive through humour. Humour, like risk taking, is highly related to learning, not to mention quality of life.

And that was my Vision of RI – no big words, no educational jargon, but more of a description of a school that had people at its heart.

Now, many years on, I honestly believe that we have that school. We have the learners, we know we can take risks, we care about each other, we like being different, and in amongst the hard work, we have fun, laughter and good times. We have that place where I wanted to be.



School Uniform

By Week 2, Term 2 all students should be in winter uniform. Students must attend school dressed in the correct uniform at all times and are expected to take a pride in their appearance whilst at school and in the community.

Girls Winter Uniform: Culottes or skirt (as for summer, Blouse, Jumper – regulation RI red jumper.

Footwear – black leather lace up shoes, white ankle socks or black opaque tights.

Boys Winter Uniform: Shirt (as for summer), Shorts (as for summer), Jumper – regulation RI Black.

The official school scarf (red and grey stripe) may be worn outside during Term 2 and 3. Regulation RI Jacket is optional and for outdoor use only. All items are available at the School Uniform Centre, 553 Remuera Rd, Remuera.



Dunedin Exchange

Each year Remuera Intermediate has an Exchange with Tahuna Intermediate School in Dunedin. They visit us early in Term 2 and we return to visit Dunedin in August of Term 3.

30 Students and 3 teachers travel up and spend a week with us: arriving Sunday 29th May and leaving Friday 3rd June.

To make this trip successful we need families to host a student from Dunedin for the week. This involves picking them up from the airport on Sunday and hosting them for the week.

On school days they come to school with their Host students and have activities planned.

If you would be able to host a student there is an application form available. Students can also access this through google docs or there are copies outside Mr Beckett's office. If you could let me know your availability over the next few weeks we can begin the selection process.
