Dear Parents of Remuera Intermediate School,

Over the past year there has been an increase in the number of thefts of students' bicycles from Remuera Intermediate School with the most recent theft occurring on Friday the 6<sup>th</sup> of May. The offenders for the theft were identified as young people who were washing windows at the Greenlane Road and Great South Road intersection. Worryingly, when one of the young people was interviewed by police he stated that the school is viewed as a "soft target" for stealing bikes.

Police will continue to partner with Auckland Council to address window washers at the intersection and work with the school to identify prevention measures to reduce the chance of bicycles being stolen, however the key to ensuring that your child's bicycle is not stolen is for you and your child to remove the opportunity for thieves to take it.

The school had recently moved the bike rack closer to the office so they were more visible to staff, so I visited the school on Friday the 13<sup>th</sup> May to understand why bikes were being easily targeted. I found that a number of bikes were left unlocked in the bike racks. In fact I saw that one bike had a chain which was not being used – this bike was a high-end bike worth over \$1000 and any thief would have loved to have had the opportunity to take just such a bike. I also noticed that a number of chains and locks being used were quite flimsy and could be easily cut.

To reduce the number of bikes being stolen from the school, I ask that:

- If your child brings a bike to school please reinforce the message that they lock it to the bike rack, or if that is full, to the wire fence.
- Consider investing in a heavy duty bike lock that will make it much harder for bike thieves to cut through.

With regards to window washers, my message is simple; don't pay them. Some of them deliberately intimidate motorists, so simply wind up your window and do not engage with them. If they approach your car put your hand up politely to say "no thanks". If they don't make any money from their 'trade' then they will soon disappear.
