I would like to take a moment to acknowledge the outstanding work of the teachers and support staff here at RI. In a recent report, I tried to capture all the additional opportunities and experiences available to the students here at RI and in doing so was reminded once again

how much our staff put into the lives of our students. Much of what our staff do is over and above their core responsibilities and most of it is in their own time or during lunch breaks.

#### STARBURST PERFORMANCE

The Year 8 Starburst Performers (up to 30 students), have been together as a group working closely with Mr Zemke since August 2016. Since that time they have become a very cohesive family-like group of singers, actors and dancers and their confidence to perform has greatly increased. This all came to an ultimate conclusion in the two performances of their show 'No More' on the 10 and 11 August.

'No More' is an original musical production with powerful themes of bullying, the negative effects it creates and helpful insights for how to handle these type of situations. The show was punctuated by strong musical numbers which followed the overall themes with choreography of various dance genres.

Ideas that were explored in the narrative of 'No More' related to cyberbullying, sharing personal stories, poetry and dance. These were expressed in conversations that happen in natural situations like the street, in a classroom, at school, at camp or online and were enhanced by dream sequences that guided the presented victims of the story with ways to alleviate their stress and help raise their confidence and self-esteem.

Our intention was to spread an empowering message, after reacting to the terrible statistics that we are constantly bombarded with related to the social disease of bullying that takes many forms. This type of abuse unfortunately continues to spread and be a very negative influence on our society but the group are still 'hopeful' that a positive change can happen and together we can all make a difference.




#### NORTH ISLAND INTERMEDIATE CYCLING CHAMPS

This is an annual event for Year 7 and 8 road cyclists from all over the North Island which takes place at the Bruce McLaren Motorsport Race Track Taupo, a fantastic location for cyclists and supporters. This year 185 students entered from more than 20 schools.

Team Time Trials (TTT) for teams of 3-5 in the morning are followed by individual road races in the afternoon. Distances for both events are 13.2 km (4 laps) for Year 7 students and 16.5 km (5 laps) for Year 8 students.

Despite competing in the competitive Year 8 Boys division for the TTT Tom Clark, Maia Barclay, Kate Waters and Charlotte Wood achieved a very impressive 14<sup>th</sup> place out of 22 teams finishing in 32 minutes (average speed 31km/h). All riders rode extremely competitively in the road races in the afternoon with Tom 5 seconds off first place in his race, Kate 8 seconds from the front and Charlotte finishing just behind the second bunch in her race. Unfortunately, Maia crashed out responding to an acceleration from the leaders in her race but recovered well to join the team for a Indian meal in Taupo on Friday night! All pupils and parents had great fun.

#### **ROCKSHOP BANDQUEST**





#### **RI SKI TEAM 2017**

The two RI Ski teams – the RI Racers and the RI Rockets – enjoyed glorious weather for the North Island Intermediate Ski Champs held between August 20-23. Both RI teams did very well in a competition featuring 75 teams. The A team of Matt Barclay, William Cotter, Mia Douglas, Phoebe Cotter and Ben Smith came 11<sup>th</sup> overall, and the B team of Braden Jones, Olivia Jones, Hamish Sherlock, Rory Cohen and Kate Robinson came 38<sup>th</sup>.

It was fantastic that all our skiers in both teams recorded times on at least one of their Giant Slalom runs, which allowed us to be positioned well for the day 2 dual slalom. The courses were tough and fast, and many crashes occurred. In the dual slalom we had a mixed bag of wins, losses and crashes, but all the RI skiers earned points for their teams. A very credible outcome.

Staying right up on the mountain was a highlight, and provided for a great venue for evening snowball fights.



#### FOOD TECHNOLOGY SHOWCASE

At the conclusion of the second cycle of the Year 8 Food Technology programme, once again family members and teachers were invited in to sample products the students had developed. This included a presentation of the students' work; the product development of a Creamy Vegetable Pasta dish using seasonal vegetables and based on the Roux sauce method, Scones with Jam and Cream and for some classes Fruity Ice-cream. Wall displays showing exemplars of student work were shared, along with Google Classroom work which was viewed on the Food Tech Chromebooks.



#### **BOARD OF TRUSTEES UPDATE**

Student wellbeing is a key indicator of the health of our School. One of the crucial things for a Board is to ask "what is the evidence" when reviewing whether we are achieving our strategic goals. We have recently seen results from two annual student surveys aimed at gaining an insight into student wellbeing. As a result, new strategies have been introduced aimed to help teachers to know their students better and enhance students' sense of belonging and engagement.

Strategies include student letters to teachers at the beginning of the year, twice yearly student wellbeing reflections and formation of a wellbeing student leadership group that feeds back class suggestions on improving wellbeing.

Year 8 classes also have wellbeing lessons incorporated in the Health curriculum including modules on bullying, nutrition, physical activity, cyber-bullying, stress and resilience.

We will be following up with a further student survey later this year to measure the impact of this work. In the meantime, I encourage you to ask your young people about these strategies – if they are anything like my children, the chances are they have not come home and shared this with the family!
